



Careers, Employability and Key Skills - Partnership with Local Authority



We work closely with local agencies to provide coordinated, specialist support for our pupils and families. Through strong collaboration, we ensure that children receive timely, tailored interventions that promote wellbeing, inclusion, and achievement.

Our partnerships include:

- Specialist workshops and counselling to support emotional wellbeing
- Early Help and family support services
- The TES Team (Targeted Education Support) for additional intervention and outreach support
- Attendance Team SEND Inclusion Team - Advice and support for pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), including EHCP processes.
- Virtual School - Support for children who are looked after or previously looked after.
- Inclusion and Outreach Services - Behaviour support, outreach teachers, and inclusion advisors.
- Safeguarding & Child Protection Team - Guidance on safeguarding procedures and multi-agency working.
- Early Help Team - Family support, Team Around the Family (TAF) meetings, and parenting programmes.
- Youth Justice Service - Support for young people at risk of offending.
- School Nursing Service - Health assessments, emotional wellbeing support, and health promotion.
- CAMHS (Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services) - Mental health assessments and therapeutic support.
- Elective Home Education Team - Monitoring and support for families who choose to home educate.
- Attendance Service / Education Welfare Officers - Support with attendance and persistent absence.
- Post-16 SEND Support & Preparing for Adulthood Team - Transition planning and careers guidance for older pupils with SEND.
- Educational Psychologist, Speech and Language Therapist and Occupational Therapist.

By working in partnership with these professionals and services, we are able to deliver a holistic approach that supports each child's academic progress, emotional wellbeing, and individual needs.
